Free Laboratory Tests for Cushing's Disease for New and Existing Cases!

Talk About laminitis is the initiative which highlights the link between laminitis, Cushing's Disease (PPID) and Equine Metabolic Syndrome (EMS). Identifying underlying issues such as PPID and EMS ensures that these horses and ponies can be correctly managed to avoid painful episodes of laminitis.

As part of the Talk About Laminitis initiative we are pleased to be one of the few practice s able to offer free laboratory test s for both *new and existing* case s of PPID meaning that you only pay for the taking of the test and a visit charge where they apply. Symptoms of PPID include laminitis, lethargy, muscle wastage, excessive drinking or urination, abnormal hair loss or recurrent infections. Introducing Equinosis[®] Q with Lameness Locator[®]

Advanced Equipment now available at Tyrrells Equine Clinic.

What is Equinosis[®] ?

The Equinosis[®] Q with Lameness Locator[®] is a veterinary diagnostic system used to objectively measure a horse's movement and is now available at Tyrrells Equine Clinic. The system provides an analysis that indicates whether the horse is lame, the severity of the lameness, the limb or limbs involved and the part of the motion cycle at which peak pain is occurring.

How does Equinosis[®] work?

Equinosis[®] consists of 3 small wireless sensors which attach to various parts of the horseone to the head, one to the right fore pastern and one to the top of the pelvis. These sensors measure the vertical movement of the horse's body as it walks and trots. This then sends information to a small hand held computer for interpretation by one of our vets. The kit is quick and easy to use and does not bother the horse at all.

Why use Equinosis [®]?

The wireless Equinosis[®] sensors measure minute changes that the human eye cannot see. It is therefore very useful in detecting subtle lameness and multiple limb lameness which can be challenging to diagnose. It is also very useful in assessing response to flexion tests and diagnostic analgesia as it gives you an objective measurement of how the horse's movement changes pre and post nerve or joint block, therefore quantifying the effectiveness of the blocks i.e. giving you a percentage the lameness has improved.

The Equinosis[®] is also very useful in the re assessment of lameness post treatment and as an ongoing monitor in the rehabilitation process as it allows your vet to see a improvement as a percentage. We will routinely use this new equipment on lameness investigations that come into the clinic but it can also be used on the yard as it is easily portable.
